

## MAGNOLIA WREATH

This workshop is open to all members of the LGC and will take place at the PWCC. The workshop will provide a demonstration and finished product that each participant will complete and take home to grace their houses. Mockups and Video link to U-Tube video, "Inspired Floral Design with Beth O'Reilly: Fall Wreaths", will be available for aid in step by step assembly. Each participant will receive a 16"D wire wreath armature, spindle of floral wire, and an assortment of leaves and other decorations, which will become part of the finished wreath.

To personalize your wreath, each participating member is asked to bring other interesting decorations; e.g. seed pods, willow branches, herbs or dried flowers which could be woven into the wreath along with the magnolia leaves.

Registration is required and will close on **October 18, 2018**, to ensure that all supplies will be available in time for the workshop.


